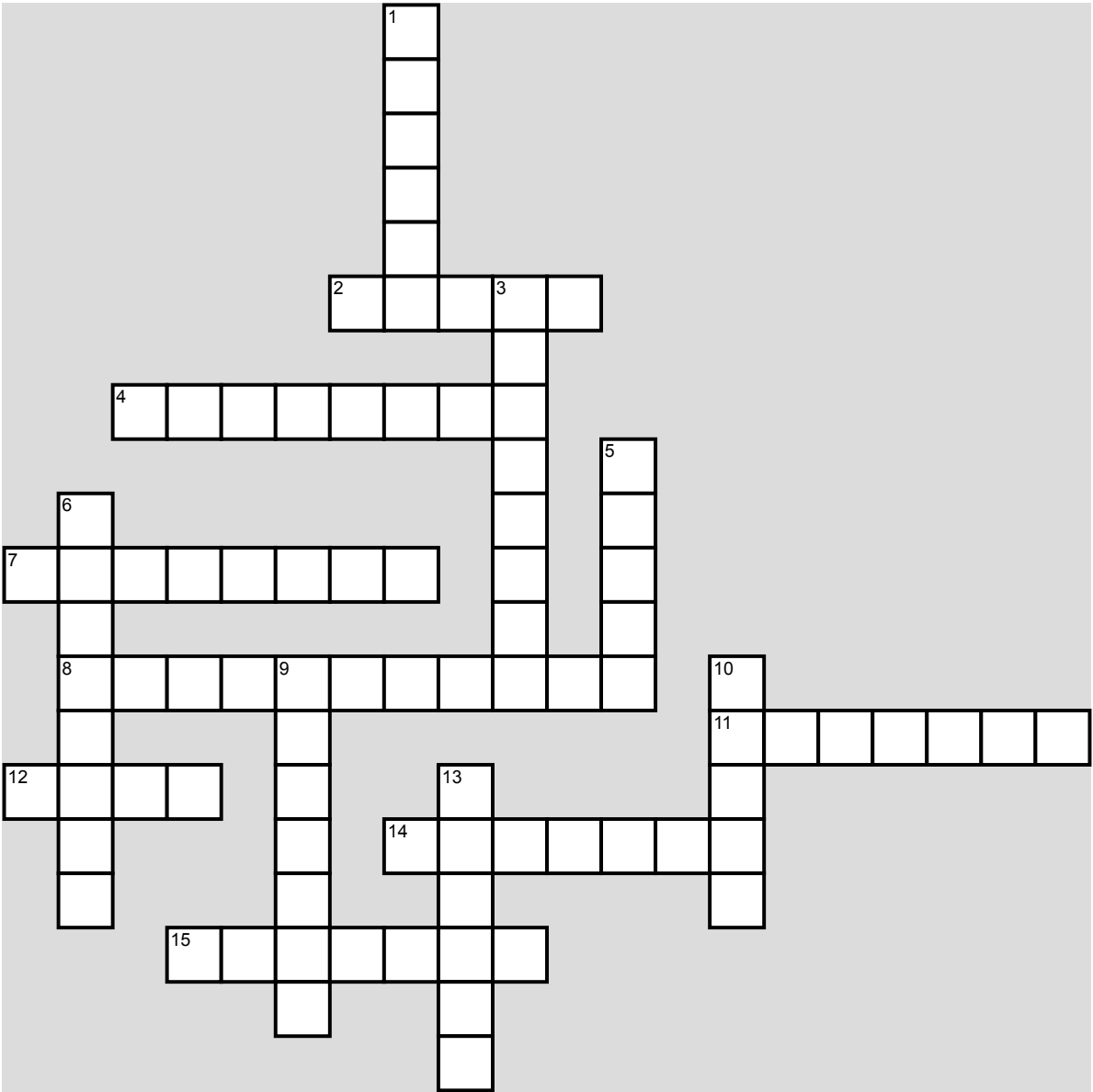


Names and Colours from With Quill and Ink and Arguing With Mary
